EQUASS Core group assures sustainable development



The EQUASS Core group was put in place in order to insure the continuity of the development, management, coordination, sales and marketing of the EQUASS system. The Core group's objective is to identify and review the operational aspects and developments of the EQUASS unit (e.g. additional need for further development, experiences with the certification programmes and consultancy activities, management aspects, coordination, sales and marketing strategy and activities). EQUASS increases capacity through Local Licence Holders

EQUASS aims to operate the EQUASS Assurance system at the national level through the mediation of a *'local licence holder'*. This national agent operates EQUASS Assurance in the national language. The Association of Vocational Rehabilitation Enterprises (AVRE) has been operating EQUASS Assurance in Norway since December 2006. LOS has been operating EQUASS Assurance in Denmark since December 2007. Excellence Ireland Quality Association (EIQA) in Ireland and the National Rehabilitation Institute in Portugal will operate EQUASS Assurance starting Autumn of 2008. It is expected that EQUASS Licence Holders will soon be operating in Germany, the Netherlands and Hungary.

Mission

EQUASS aims to enhance the social services sector by engaging service providers in quality and continuous improvement, and by guaranteeing service-users quality of services throughout Europe.

EQUASS: A unique multi stakeholder approach

EQUASS defines quality as: 'Meeting and exceeding the needs and expectations of all stakeholders'. Therefore the EQUASS approach is a typical multi-stakeholder approach in which all stakeholders have been consulted in defining the criteria for certification. The EQUASS quality approach explicitly includes the perspective of service users. While most of the international quality approaches contribute to the efficiency of organisations and therefore focuses on control of the internal processes (efficiency), the EQUASS quality approach emphasises control in order to achieve desired results (effectiveness). The EQUASS approach also incorporates the methodology of self-assessment as a fundamental element in the audit process.





Mrs Kerstin Farm from the Region of Orebro in Sweden will represent the European Network of Social Authorities (ENSA) in the EQUASS Awarding Committee. ENSA is a network of cities and European Regions that aims to promote international cooperation, and exchange mutual understanding of knowledge and experience within the field of social services.

'EQUASS in Practice'

'EQUASS in Practice' is an international project in the framework of the Leonardo DaVinci Programme. The project aims to develop and to share best practice in the implementation of EQUASS Assurance for VETservice providers, with the goal of improving the quality of their services and to achieve sustainable working practice and routines. Partners from Lithuania, Slovenia, Portugal, Belgium, Ireland and Norway will make EQUASS Assurance more readily available to all VET-providers

within the sector of vocational rehabilitation. The programme of the project includes development of methods, guidelines and strategies which will result in a practical web-based manual which will coach the VETproviders through their quality assurance work (quality assurance), and enable them to become certified. The Association of Vocational Rehabilitation Enterprises (AVRE) is project promoter and the project will last for 2 years.

EQUASS is an initiative of the European Platform for Rehabilitation (EPR). EQUASS provides a range of comprehensive services in the area of approval and certification of quality, all of which comply with the European requirements for quality in the provision of Social Services.
